





The basic requirements to apply for fellowship are board cer fica on, licensure, clinical prac ce for 3 years out of residency, and being a dues paying member for the previous 3 years. Addi onal requirements include other professional ac vi es – teaching, community service, leadership, scholarship, etc.

# In remembrance of Dr. J. Harold "Jay" Morris


J. Harold "Jay" Morris, MD, 93, passed away in Kansas City from a long term illness. Dr. Morris was the Missouri ACP Governor from 1987-1991. He aended the University of Missouri -Columbia for medical school, then aended the University of Kansas where he received his Medical Doctorate degree. He had a one-year internship at the Kansas University Medical Center (KUMC), served two years in the United States Navy as a medical officer, then returned to KUMC where he completed his three years of residency in IM, and one year of fellowship in endocrinology. He pracced IM for 36 years before rering in 1999. He also served as a Clinic Professor of Medicine at UMKC and the Program Director of the Connuing Medical Educaon Division at UMKC.

A devoted member of the American College of Physicians, Dr. Morris was elected a Fellow in 1968, served as a Regent from 1991-1997, Vice Chair of the Board of Regents in 1995, and was elected Master (MACP) in 1998. Our chapter honored him with the Laureate award in 1991. The Missouri Society of Internal Medicine honored him with their Disnguished Internist of the Year A ward in 1983, 1989 and 1995.

It is the dedicaon of physicians like Dr.

Morris that have made Missouri ACP

what it is today.
